GEN 1.2 ENTRY, TRANSIT AND DEPARTURE OF AIRCRAFT

1. GENERAL

- 1.1 All flights into, from or over the Hashemite kingdom of Jordan territory shall be subject to the current Jordanian regulations relating to civil aviation. These regulations correspond in all essentials to the Standards and Recommended Practices contained in Annex 9 to the Convention on International Civil Aviation.
- 1.2 Aircraft flying into or departing from Jordanian territory shall make their first landing at or final departure from an international aerodrome. (See AIP JORDAN, AD 1.3, and AD 2).

2. SCHEDULED FLIGHTS

2.1 General

For regular international scheduled flights operated by foreign airlines into or in transit across Jordan the following requirements must be met:

- The state to which the airline belongs must be a party to the International Air Services
 Transit Agreement and/or the International Air Transport Agreement.
 Jordan is a party to both agreements
- 2) The airline operations should be eligible to make flight under the provisions of bilateral or multilateral agreements to which the state of the airline and the state of registry are contracting parties and must have a permit to operate into or in transit across Jordan. 2.2 Documentary Requirements for Clearance Of Aircraft

2.2.1 It is necessary that the under mentioned aircraft documents be submitted by airline operators for clearance on entry and departure of their aircraft to and from Jordan .All documents listed below must follow the ICAO standard format as set forth in the relevant appendices to Annex 9 and are acceptable when furnished in Arabic or English. Documents must be signed either by the pilot in command of the aircraft or his officially recognized.

3. NON-SCHEDULED FLIGHTS

3.1 Procedures

3.1.1 If an operator intends to perform (a series of) Non-scheduled flight(s) into Jordan for taking on or discharging passengers, Cargo or Mail, he shall apply to the:

For permission to carry out such operations not less than 72 hours in advance of the intended landing.

The application must include the following information in the order shown hereunder:

- a) Name of operator.
- b) Type of Aircraft and registration marks.
- c) Date and time of arrival at, and departure from Jordan.
- d) Place or places of embarkation or disembarkation abroad as the case may be, of passengers and/or freight.
- e) Purpose of flight and number of passengers and/or Nature and amount of freight.
- f) Name, address and business of charterer if any.

3.1.2 Application for Non-Scheduled Traffic to over fly Amman FIR

All Airlines and operators of non-scheduled traffic intending to over fly Amman FIR and or land in Jordan for technical purposes are requested to submit an application to obtain clearance 24 hours in advance. NO traffic to leave point of departure till over flying clearance is approved and received; such flights are required to forward the following details:

- a) Name of operator.
- b) Type and registration of aircraft.
- c) Nature and purpose of flight.
- d) In case of Cargo, nature of contents should be clearly specified.
- v) Point of departure and point of arrival.

NOTE: The validity of landing clearance is 48 Hours and over flying Clearance is 72 Hours.

4. PRIVATE FLIGHTS

4.1 Advance Notification of Arrival

4.1.1 Aircraft wishing to perform private flights to Jordan or to over fly Jordanian territory are required to submit an application to obtain prior permission 48 hours in advance, stating clearly the data mentioned in Para 3.1.1

4.1.2 Application for permission must be submitted to the:

Chief Commissioner of Civil Aviation Regulatory Commission; at least 48 Hours in advance of the entry into the airspace over Jordanian territory.

5. PUBLIC HEALTH MEASURES APPLIED TO AIRCRAFT

5.1 No public health measures are required to be carried out in respect to aircraft entering Jordan unless the aircraft arrives from another country which has been notified as an infected area. The government reserves the right to disinfect every aircraft coming from an area of yellow fever infections.
